A vision becomes a life


A generous gift in a Will is where the Royal Flying Doctor Service all began.

The work of the Flying Doctor

Your support helps us continue our thorough research, work closely with public health officials, and consult with our patients to identify and overcome barriers that outback communities face.

Emergency Retrieval

Often living hours away from the nearest hospital, people in remote communities rely on us to be there for them in an emergency. Our frontline teams work tirelessly 24/7, your support can mean the difference between life and death.

Maternal and Child Healthcare

Our experienced team of clinicians, including midwives, deliver primary healthcare services and clinics for women, paediatric and family health. We play a critical role in the health and wellbeing of families living in remote and rural areas.

Dental Care

Rural areas only have one dentist to every three in city areas. Dental health is fundamental to overall health, wellbeing, and quality of life. Our teams offer this vital service that would otherwise be unavailable to these rural communities.

GP Clinics

With the life expectancy of regional families up to 2.2 years less than those in major cities, our primary healthcare teams are working hard to provide lifesaving services and specialist care, including dermatologists, optometrists, and chronic disease management.

Patient Transfer

Whether it is transporting patients from hospital to hospital, by air or by road, we play a vital role in inter-hospital transfers in less urgent cases in many parts of Australia.

Mental Health Support

Isolation and distance, worsened by the ongoing drought, means access to our Mental Health services and Alcohol and Other Drug programs are vital to support the wellbeing of our patients.

Being there for farming fa

There was no time to waste

Life on the farm can be challenging, and the Rohde family would like to share why your support matters so greatly to families living in rural areas.

12-year old Braith was helping his family muster cattle when he came off his motorbike. His mother Alison rushed to his side and knew immediately that her son's situation was critical.

"I could see that Braith had blood coming from his nose and mouth. He was badly suffering from shock and I knew, living out of town, it would take too long for an ambulance to get to our farm."

Alison did not hesitate to put Braith straight into the truck and got him to the closest doctor in Moree, NSW as quickly as she could.

"Braith's situation was becoming life threatening as they couldn't find a pulse in his arm, and he could lose it. We were told they needed to fly him out straight away". – Alison, farmer and mother

The Royal Flying Doctor Service were called in to rush Braith to a major hospital in Brisbane. Thanks to generous supporters like you, Braith received the urgent medical care he needed in an emergency and has fully recovered. He is now in his last year of high school and his family could not be more grateful for your help.

"It always worries me that if an accident happens, we're hours away from the help we'd need. That's why we couldn't live out here without the Royal Flying Doctor Service," shared Alison.

Every gift, no matter the size, can change the lives of Australians for generations.

How to leave a gift in

Choose a gift in your Will that's right for you

After you've looked after your loved ones, there are many ways to include us in your Will. Three of the easiest options to leave a gift are:

A RESIDUAL GIFT

Leaving a percentage or whole of your remaining (residue) estate after all provisions have been made for your loved ones and expenses have been paid is a practical way to give. This also accounts for inflation and does not decrease in value over time.

A PERCENTAGE

Another flexible way to give as you don't have to adjust the value of your gift to account for inflation, or changes to your total assets. It is a percentage of your whole estate.

A FIXED AMOUNT

Leaving a specific sum; this type of gift may need to be changed over the years to account for inflation and changes to your circumstances.

Legal Wording

We encourage you to seek professional legal advice when making a Will. Below is sample wording on how to remember us in your Will.
